Report of the Director of Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve the costs for dropped-crossings on Castle Shaw Road in Offerton.

2. BACKGROUND

The user of a mobility scooter contacted the Council about the apparent lack of dropped-crossings on Castle Shaw Road which provides a route to local amenities off Mallowdale Road. Note: Dropped-crossings (or lowered-kerbs) provide a facility to assist wheelchairs, pushchairs and other vulnerable road users for crossing the carriageway.

There is scope to construct a crossing at the 'top' of Castle Shaw Road on either side of the junction at Blackstone Road and further down on either side of the junction with Ashway Clough South.

The associated cost for the civil works would be £3,550.00 funded from the Offerton Delegated Ward Budget.
