Working Together in Stockport

Key finding of the LGA Peer Review was to develop a Co-production Action Plan based upon resident's feedback

We commissioned an engagement piece with residents in Stockport who draw on ASC and their family, friends and carers. The findings of this work form the basis of this Working in Partnership Action Plan.

People told us they prefer to use the term 'Working In Partnership' instead of co-production to show the importance of making decisions together and shared power.

We are committed to working in partnership with the people we serve which is supported by the <u>Think Local Act Personal principles</u> and the Making it Real 'I' statements.





To be the best place to live happy and healthy lives over the next fifteen years, we must have a relentless focus on the biggest challenges facing our borough:

- Evidence increased shared power and decision making

Working in Partnership Feedback from People

- Use feedback and learning to improve and develop ASC
- Create an annual report from feedback evidencing changes to the service and report through governance processes.
- Develop and enhance ASC's proactive prevention offer

Championing Working in Partnership

- Plan and deliver an annual system-wide Working In Partnership Conference.
- Engage all system partners to champion the voice of people to ensure they are at the heart of all we do

Delivering as One Stockport

- Working as One Team to contribute to the review of the Co-Production Charter
- ASC Co-Production Lead to drive the voice of adults with care and support needs and carers in wider council activities

Developing Practice

- Use the findings of the independent report, to determine mandatory training delivered by people expert by their experience to all staff
- Work with the MiR Board and develop best practice guide for all staff and include the Board in the development of ongoing practice tools

Training & Recruitment

- Support recruitment initiatives to ensure experts by experience are able to contribute to recruitment at all levels within the organisation.
- Continue to develop training and practice tools which support keeping people at the heart of all that we do

Commissioning

· Work with colleagues in commissioning to involve experts by experience in all areas of commissioning including strategy, tendering, quality assurance, recruitment and training, and strengthbased outcomes-focused commissioning and delivery.

Influencing Regional and **National Networks**

- Linking into regional and national co-production networks, forums and events to share knowledge and learning to inform local initiatives and to be a voice for local people in national approaches.
- Working with all Partnership Boards to support and strengthen an integrated approach

- •Contribute to the analysis of the feedback forms to see if we are meeting the objectives in our ASC Charter.
- •Supporting mystery shopping.
- Work with The Quality Officers and Practice Lead about how to work with ASC Teams to promote Working in Partnership.
- Provide feedback and solutions to service from feedback from Partnership Boards.

- Work with the Greater Manchester Social Work Academy expert by experience group linked with Social Work degree courses.
- Continue to participate in events such as the Co-production (Working-in-Partnership) Cuppa, an informal national network of co-production leads offering peer support and advice hosted by UCL.
- Support The Co-production Collaborative made up of a number of Co-production (Working-in-Partnership) Leads who meet on an ad hoc basis to share examples of best practice relating to working in partnership, e'g', sharing templates regarding charters, supporting each other in writing strategy documents, etc.
- Share with other authorities our Working in Partnership journey.
- Planned participation in Social Care Futures event to be held in Manchester in September 2024.
- Planned participation in the Big Chat presentation with Making it Real Board Co-Chair at the national ADASS conference in Liverpool in November 2024.
