Proposed Traffic Regulation Order 'No Waiting at Any Time' and Introduction of a Bus Clearway on Lingard Lane, Bredbury

Report of the Director of Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To report the findings of a consultation exercise and to seek approval for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) and introduction of a Bus Clearway.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1. Traffic Services received a request from the Highway Ward Spokespersons for the Bredbury and Woodley Ward to investigate safety concerns as it had been reported that vehicles are parking in such a manner that they are obstructing the footways and parking too close to the junction with Ashton Road preventing motorists from using the dedicated left turn filter lane at the signalised junction correctly.

3. PROPOSALS

3.1. Due to the nature of the concerns raised, Traffic Services propose to introduce a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) – 'No Waiting at Any Time' together with the introduction of a Bus Clearway operational 24hrs. These proposals are shown on Drawing No. **NM8-5165-01 Rev A.**

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

5.1. No other alternatives were considered.

6. CONSULTATION

- 6.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.2. Greater Manchester Police have been consulted and they have no objections to these proposals.

6.3. Affected residents have been consulted, from a total of 11 no. letters delivered, 1 no. response (9%) has been received. The response received supports the proposals.

Comments Received:

The Double Yellow lines also need to be extended to the west of the entrance to the industrial estate in addition to the proposed as motorists cannot see traffic approaching from Brinnington due to vehicles obstructing the view.

Traffic Services Response:

The junction of Lingard Lane and the industrial estate is rather wide (in excess of 20m). Network Management Officers have carried out additional site visits following which we do not consider sight lines are an issue for those egressing from the industrial estate. We consider that reducing parking in this area will encourage vehicles to park in other areas to the detriment of the overall aspiration of this scheme.

Appendix A

Proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) – 'No Waiting at Any Time'

Lingard Lane, Bredbury – North Side

From a point 14 metres west of the intersection of the western kerb line of Ashton Road for a distance of 47 metres in a westerly direction.

Lingard Lane, Bredbury - South Side

From a point 24 metres west of the intersection of the western kerb line of Ashton Road for a distance of 20 metres in a westerly direction.
