2nd Cheadle Scout Group is a registered charity which provides structured activities to young people to enable them to achieve their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals, as responsible citizens and as valued members of their local, national and international communities.

We have around 190 young members in the Group, ranging from Squirrels who join us at the age of four, through to Network who stay with until they reach the age of 25. We have over 40 leaders across our sections, all of whom give up their time to help to plan and deliver fun and challenging activities.

The Group has enjoyed healthy membership numbers over recent years and every section is either at or close to capacity, and we have a long waiting list of children who wish to join us when they reach Squirrel-age.

For many years, the Group has also been active in raising additional funds through our annual Ram Roast event, Spring Bedding Plant sale and other activities, which has enabled us to maintain our land and buildings and to invest in new equipment. This fundraising has been augmented with ad hoc grant applications to local government and businesses that have been used to purchase equipment which we are able to use in our activities - examples of recent purchases include a minibus, go karts and kayaks which all are used by our young members on a regular basis.

9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activity

Over the last 6 months we've had problems with blocked drains from our headquarters in the foul sewer before it joins with United Utilities main sewer in the highway on The Paddock. This was a particular issue during this year's Group fundraiser the Ram Roast, which was held at our HQ due to the poor ground conditions at the Abney Centre.

After further investigations and a camera surveys (at our cost), a number of blockages were identified with costs associated with remedial works to remove trees, excavate and replace damaged parts of our foul sewer amounting to around £4,500 for two initial blockages before the camera couldn't proceed any further. The blockages are tree roots and a collapsed drain.

Our foul sewer runs for around 50m within our boundary before it branches out to the public sewer and therefore is our responsibility. The sewer runs underneath our driveway into the car park, a wooded area, earth bunds and landscaped area into our activity field. The sewer was installed in 1970 when our headquarters was built and connects where the previous two Scout headquarters once stood which is now our activity field.

The Group Trustees felt the cost associated in the initial remedial works and subsequent works would be better spent future proofing the foul sewer by putting in a new connection directly outside our headquarters building without the need for the removal of any trees, earth bunds or established landscaped area.

After obtaining quotations, the Trustees have approved a quotation with Drainage Consultants Ltd based in Hazel Grove who would complete the project including all licences and approval with United Utilities and SMBC highway permits etc. at a cost of £11,778 inc vat.
