Report of the Director of Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve the cost for the installation of 20mph roundel carriageway markings in Woodsmoor.

2. BACKGROUND

During a Ward Briefing, a Councillor highlighted the concerns of residents on Cromley Road who report that some drivers are not respecting the 20mph speed limit which covers this and other roads in Woodsmoor.

In considering this location, there is scope to provide 20mph roundel carriageway markings to support the speed limit. Note: This part of Woodsmoor is not a Conservation Area where street signage etc. needs to be minimised.

The locations for the roundel markings are shown on attached drawing number: **NM18-6020-001**. The Ward Councillors have supported these measures and the submission of a report to Area Committee to approve the lining costs which will be £2,000 funded from the delegated Ward Budget (Norbury & Woodsmoor).
