## Bramhall North (BN)

## Comments of the (Acting) Returning Officer

All rooms have disabled access and the review has taken into consideration that there should be no barriers to voting for people with a disability.

BN4/BN7 – There is a large electorate allocated to this polling station with many electors accessing the station by car. The Brookdale Theatre is substantially easier to access from Bridge Lane and has a significant number of parking spaces available. It is believed that this location will be more accessible than the existing arrangements and more suitable for high-turnout elections such as general elections.

BN6 – This small polling district was created at the 2022 Polling Place Review to allow for the Electoral Registration Officer to continue to produce electoral registers on the old ward boundaries, as was a legal requirement at that time. There is no longer such a requirement and therefore this district is superfluous, and it is proposed to rationalise the polling district scheme by merging BN6 into BN4. There would be noticeable change for the electors affected, who already vote at the polling station for BN4.

BN2 – Due to RAAC issues at Bramhall High School, the polling station was moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Bramhall Scout Headquarters at the 2024 elections. With the next scheduled elections not until 2026, it is not proposed to make this a permanent change at this time.

There have been no issues with access to polling stations in BN1, BN2, BN3 or BN5 and therefore no changes are proposed at present.
