WARD DISCRETIONARY BUDGET - CHEADLE EAST AND CHEADLE HULME NORTH (2)

Report of the Assistant Director for Legal & Democratic Governance

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1. The Area Committee is asked to consider a proposed local project for the installation of a defibrillator at All Hallows Church, Cheadle, and recommend that the Cabinet Member for Finance & Resources approve the allocation of £1,800 from the Ward Discretionary Budget (Cheadle East & Cheadle Hulme North ward allocation) to facilitate the project.

2. BACKGROUND AND PROPOSED WORK

- 2.1. All Hallows Church have proposed a local project for the installation of a defibrillator at All Hallows Church for community use. In the case that the device is needed, the proposed location of the device is expected to have a wide reach owing to the site's proximity to local shops, educational and leisure facilities. All Hallows Church would be responsible for ongoing maintenance of the device.
- 2.2. A quote has been received from the British Heart Foundation, setting out the costs for the defibrillator which are as follows:

Defibrillator £1,000 Cabinet £600 Installation £200 Total £1,800

2.3. It is proposed that the work be funded by the Ward Discretionary Budget (Cheadle East & Cheadle Hulme North ward allocation). This is the second project for the proposed use of the Ward's Discretionary Budget. If the funding for this proposed project is allocated, £4,200 will remain in the Ward's Discretionary Budget.

3. RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1. That the Area Committee endorses the proposed project outlined in the report and recommend that the Cabinet Member for Finance & Resources approves the use of £1,800 from the Ward Discretionary Budget (Cheadle East & Cheadle Hulme North ward allocation) to facilitate the project.
- 3.2. That a representative of the Assistant Director for Legal & Democratic Governance be authorised to progress the allocating of the funds accordingly (subject to the approval of funds by the Cabinet Member for Finance & Resources).
