1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek the approval for the supply and installation of 5 no. Middleton Bollards outside no. 84 Station Road, Cheadle Hulme, to prevent motorists from parking their vehicles on the footway and causing an obstruction for motorists and pedestrians.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1. It has been reported that motorists are driving over the footway and parking vehicles fully on the footway in this busy area. This behaviour is causing an obstruction around the area which include local amenities and a mini roundabout junction for both pedestrians and motorists.

3. PROPOSALS

3.1. To address the concerns raised, it is proposed to install x5 no. Middleton style bollards as shown on **Drawing No. NM18-6419-01.**

4. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

4.1 The area already benefits from a No Waiting at Any Time Traffic Regulation Order (double yellow lines. Parking enforcement has been requested, with numerous visits having taken place. However, with motorists parking at the location for short periods of time, they move their vehicle(s) before the Civil Enforcement Officers have been able to attend and complete the issuing of the Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) process.

5. CONSULTATION

5.1 It is not necessary to conduct a consultation for the installation of these Middleton bollards.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1. The estimated costs of this scheme are as follows:

Supply and installation of x5 no. Middleton Bollards.

Total £2.500

To be funded from the Bramhall North Delegated Ward Budget

7.1. Timescale for completion is estimated to be 8 to 12 weeks.
