Purpose of the report:

- To provide Board members with an update on public engagement taking place across the ONE Stockport Health and Care Partnership.
- Provide a brief update on the thematic partnerships that feed into the Locality Board.
- Give Board members a first look at the draft engagement write up from Stockport's NHS Fit For the Future public engagement report, which will feed into the overall report for Greater Manchester at the end of the Fit For the Future programme (in March 2025).

Key points (Executive Summary):

This report combines insights from public health and care related engagement and thematic partnerships to highlight progress in shaping health and care services in Stockport.

- The **NHS Fit for the Future Engagement Event**, hosted by NHS Greater Manchester and Healthwatch Stockport, gathered feedback on health inequalities, service integration, mental health resources, and accessibility. Public input emphasised priorities such as prevention, improved IT systems, staff recruitment, and better communication. Attendees praised the event's inclusivity and commitment to transparency.
- The **Community Voice Partnership (CVP)** collates feedback from thematic partnerships, including carers, mental health, learning disabilities, and equity networks. These partnerships identified key challenges in primary care access, support for people with additional needs, and gaps in housing and social care. Initiatives include developing GP accreditation models, promoting quality standards, and recruiting lived experience representatives.
- Cross-cutting themes highlight the need for accessible services, digital support, and collaboration to address local priorities, ensuring community-led health and care initiatives for Stockport.
