6. Please describe the main activities of your Organisation/ Group

Wellbeing activities and events for the LGBT+ community - discussion groups, games nights, clothes swap, network, badminton. Connecting the community and combating social isolation. Improving access to healthcare, understanding in education, working with the council to eliminate hate crime. Raising awareness of discrimination and celebrating our community's talents. We have created ever-growing community events over the past 5 years through the network to mark International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia (IDAHOBIT) and Trans Day of Remembrance (TDOR) attended by some of the councillors here today and in partnership with network organisations such as the Proud Trust and Stockport Libraries.

Our work is vital because the LGBTQ+ community (Hidden Figures, LGBT Foundation, 2023):

- has higher rates of depression, substance abuse, isolation, domestic abuse and suicide rates compared to the general population.
- suffered an increase of 112% of hate crimes over the past 5 years.
- is more likely to experience discrimination in the workplace, educational settings and when accessing healthcare.

"Really great experience meeting new people and friendly faces. It's been really nice seeing people overcome social anxiety and opening up!"

"Games night has been hugely important for combating loneliness, and for helping me build connections with other LGBT folks during a confusing time."

One-off event - celebrating our 5th birthday in 2025 with a ball/prom. This is not just a party - for many of our community, they were denied the opportunity to attend their school prom or to attend it as their true selves. This is an opportunity for those people to experience the coming of age event 'Fabulously Me' and to know that they are accepted for who they are, as they are. The ball will be held at a central, accessible Stockport location (Edgeley Park) with food, a photographer, and live entertainment. And to really bring the experience to life - a red carpet to be rolled out to welcome them.

This event will bring together people from different walks of life, encourage engagement with our wellbeing activities and network. It will also celebrate our achievements over the past 5 years - including the volunteers who have helped to make it what it is today.

We would like to take this opportunity to show our gratitude for previous ward flexibility funding, which allowed us to buy refreshments for our attendees at our Spill The T discussion groups and badminton - these sessions are a lifeline for our members to be able to become more active, and to participate in discussions, learning and crafting activities which are so beneficial for their wellbeing. Because of this funding we have been able to provide safe and welcoming spaces for those who would otherwise be isolated.

10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

100 - this is the capacity of the event space at Edgeley Park. This will be made up of our active members (68), social media followers (1054), and our partners in the VCFSE sector. According to the 2021 census there are over 20,000 LGBTQ+ residents in Stockport - Edgeley has the highest concentration in the borough.

Other beneficiaries - the businesses and music acts we will be investing in.

Untold numbers of younger LGBT+ people who are struggling with their identity and not accepted at home/school/work who can see that there are people willing to accept them unconditionally.

No - we are inviting our members but also our allies from the third sector who have supported us over the past 5 years.
