# Report of the Director of Place Management

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve the cost for a feasibility study for a pedestrian crossing facility. The location under consideration is the corridor formed by Station Road and Vale Road near the junction with Craig Road in Heaton Mersey.

### 2. BACKGROUND

Local Ward Councillors have expressed concerns about pedestrians crossing safely at the said junction and have asked for a feasibility study into providing a facility to improve conditions (possibly a pedestrian refuge island or a zebra crossing).

### 3. PROPOSALS

A feasibility study would include the following:

- An assessment to determine the type and size of vehicles using these roads.
- Feasibility design drawings.
- Swept paths (tracking).
- A search for statutory services (possible diversions).
- Drainage and lighting survey.
- Topological survey.
- Advice on possible options, costs and available funding sources.

### 4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The associated cost to commission a study by the Feasibility and Design Team would be £5,000 funded from the Delegated Ward Budget (Heatons South).

### 5. TIMESCALES

If funding is approved, the study is expected to be completed in 2025.
