# <u>Proposed Traffic Regulation Order 'No Waiting At Any Time' on Old Chapel Street</u> and Adelaide Road, Edgeley

# Report of the Director of Place Management

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To report the findings of a consultation exercise and to seek approval for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO).

### 2. BACKGROUND

2.1. Traffic Services received a request from the Highway Ward Spokesperson for the Edgeley Ward to investigate safety concerns as it had been reported that vehicles are parking close to the junctions of Old Chapel Street and Adelaide Road, obscuring visibility and hindering traffic movement.

### 3. PROPOSALS

3.1. Due to the nature of the concerns raised, Traffic Services propose to introduce a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) – 'No Waiting At Any Time'. These proposals are shown on **Drawing No. NM8-5263-01**.

### 4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

### 5. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

5.1. No other alternatives were considered.

### 6. CONSULTATION

- 6.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.2. Greater Manchester Police have been consulted and they have no objections to these proposals.
- 6.3. Affected residents have been consulted with and from a total of 7 letters delivered, 4 responses (57%) have been received. Of the responses received, 0 responses (0%) are in support of the proposals and 4 responses (100%) do not support the proposals.

# Proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) - 'No Waiting At Any Time'

# <u>Adelaide Road, Edgeley – Both Sides</u>

From the intersection of the northern kerb line of Old Chapel Street for a distance of 10 metres in a north westerly direction.

# Old Chapel Street, Edgeley - North Side

From a point 10 metres south west of the intersection of the western kerb line of Adelaide Road to a point 10 metres south east of the eastern kerb line of Adelaide Road.
