Edgeley Resident Parking Scheme Consultation Results

Report of the Director of Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report details the findings of a consultation exercise undertaken to ascertain residents' appetite for the introduction of a resident permit parking scheme on various streets within Edgeley Ward.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. A parking survey for Bridge Hall, Cale Green, Edgeley and Shaw Heath was carried out between October and December 2023 and the results were presented to Central Area Committee on 18th April 2024.
- 2.2. Due to the responses received from the survey, Local Councillors for Edgeley Ward requested that Network Management progress a consultation to determine how many residents would be in support of a resident permit parking scheme.
- 2.3. At Central Stockport Area Committee on 31st October 2024 the consultation exercise was approved.
- 2.4. A consultation exercise was carried out between 14th January 2025 and 7th February 2025 to ascertain whether the residents supported the introduction of a resident permit parking scheme.
- 2.5. The consultation exercise included a letter drop to 1332 residential properties within the boundary of the attached plan – Edgeley Resident Permit Parking Scheme – directing residents to the online survey so they could provide their views and comments on the possible introduction of a new scheme. A paper copy was available on request.
- 2.6. One of the main criteria of Stockport Councils Residential Parking Scheme Policy is a stipulation that a minimum of 51% support from all households within a road/street/area must be reached to enable progression of a permit scheme.

3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. Due to there already being a shortfall in parking spaces, a Resident Parking Scheme would not alleviate the parking issues. If the scheme were to progress, residents would be offered 2 permits per property with the ability to park anywhere within the zone. In line with the current policy this would not offer the guarantee of a space as the scheme works on a first come first serve basis.
- 3.2. Network Management is obliged to adhere to Council Policy when making parking scheme considerations. Due to the required minimum support not being achieved at consultation, it is the recommendation of Network Management that no further action is taken, with the exception of Hardman Street which local Councillors wish to progress a residents permit parking scheme.

4. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

4.1. No other alternatives were considered.

5. CONSULTATION

- 5.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and separate meetings have been held to discuss the outcomes of the consultation.
- 5.2. It was noted that whilst Hardman Street had a total of 129 residences, they are made up of a block of flats (Hollywood Towers) and 6 individual houses. Although overall there was only a 7% response rate for the street, residents from 4 of the 6 individual houses indicated they were in favour of a residents parking scheme (67%).
- 5.2 Affected households were consulted; from a total of 1332 no. letters delivered, 217 no. (16%) responses were received, 1115 (84%) properties did not respond to the consultation. From the responses received, 100 no. (46%) supported the introduction of a resident permit parking scheme, and 117 no. (54%) did not support the introduction of a resident permit parking scheme. However, including those who didn't respond, the overall percentage in support is reduced to 7.5%. The introduction of a resident permit parking scheme requires 51% in support.
- 5.3. It was noted that some households submitted the online consultation more than once, so only one response per household has been counted.
